In recent months, the Sisters of SCMM Indonesia Province have been participating in the Ecology Day activities organised by the Diocese. As it is proclaimed in our Church to be a 'Synodal Church, walking together', our Sisters also carry out this activity together with the people of God. The activities carried out are cleaning the church environment, organising greening by planting trees and creating a mini park around the church building. The Dutch province currently has 79 members with an average age of 88.8 years.
